- ✓ The City of San Diego's comprehensive program to allow permanent outdoor community gathering spaces within areas of the public right of way, including vehicle-accommodating spaces.
- ✓ Incorporate design and safety standards for public right-of-way use for eating and drinking establishments, recreation, public art, education, and entertainment.
- ✓ Create pedestrian and bike-friendly public spaces that meet the city's economic, social equity, and environmental goals.
